The Circus was really fun this year. The kids, and the adults, had a great time. This year's show was a little different than last years, and if Stan has it in 2012 it should be even bigger and better.



year. This will be good news for the Nobles of Alcazar who have worked diligently in this endeavor. Under this year's leadership, Alcazar has turned around the declining revenue problem. It now looks like Alcazar will not have to use any Temple equity in order to meet the obligations of Alcazar. This makes me very proud as the Treasurer of Alcazar.

All of the Temple and Clubs insurance policies are now under one major policy, which save costs, and could be an additional saving in the future for Alcazar. The Temple utilities have been reduced in cost by conservation. This year's Potentate has made some bold moves in saving, in regards to reimbursement, of travel expenses for representatives and the Divan. As you can see, this is just a sample of the savings that is going on at Alcazar.

On the revenue side, the rentals are just fantastic this year. Customer-friendly Noble Danny Lockwood has stepped up to the plate and is doing a superb job. The circus revenue this year was impressive, and has the possibility to do even better in the coming years. Our clubs in their fundraisers seem to be doing very well this year, and we trust they will support the Temple in its fundraisers as we go forward. We do need more support from our Nobles in the Temple fundraising activities, like bingo and other functions. I urge every Noble as you attend our bi-monthly meetings to ask questions about your Temple finances.

Each Noble should know how much revenue is needed to operate our Temple, and especially the cost of our Temple operations. Your Temple finance reports are no longer on the EXCEL program, but are reported in the Peachtree accounting system. That means when a deposit of money is made in the bank and recorded, the deposit

flows immediately into the budget. The same applies when a check is written for expense. So at any given time, I can readily explain to any Noble any questions that may arise. I do believe that when a Noble understands the financial position of the Temple and knows how the Temple money is being spent, it becomes much easier to get workers for Temple fundraising activities. As your Treasurer, I have an open door policy to any questions that you may have in regards to our Temple finances, and welcome your response.

# Pioneering Burn Treatment Saves Teen

All Care and Services are Provided Regardless of the Patients' Ability to Pay

In December 2010, fire broke out in DJ Brown's family home in West Viriginia. DJ rushed inside to rescue his sister and the family dogs - unaware they had already escaped.

DJ sustained a 90 percent burn injury, so severe that he was immediately transferred to Shriners Hospitals for Children®— Cincinnati.

"In many hospitals and only until recently, children with this extensive of a burn injury would not have survived," said Richard Kagan, M.D., chief of staff.

"Our reputation speaks for itself," said Debbie Harrell, RN, MSN, director of professional relations at the hospital. "We recognize that it is not an easy decision for families to travel to Cincinnati for burn care. We see patients from 22 states, and I can honestly say families are satisfied with their decision to come here for expert pediatric burn care."

Especially important are the support services provided after the burn injury. Together, the experts at the hospital address all aspects of a patient's physical and emotional needs and develop a comprehensive, individualized rehabilitation plan for each child.

Recognizing the importance of support for burn survivors, the hospital is cohosting the 2011 Phoenix Society's World Burn Congress in Cincinnati. More than 800 burn survivors, their families, and others celebrated the important work done by the Phoenix Society. For more than 30 years, the society has worked with survivors, families, healthcare professionals, the fire industry and donors to support burn recovery, improve the quality of burn care, and prevent burn injuries.

"One of the many messages taken from the gathering is that even though your physical appearance may have changed on the outside, it does not change the person you are on the inside."
