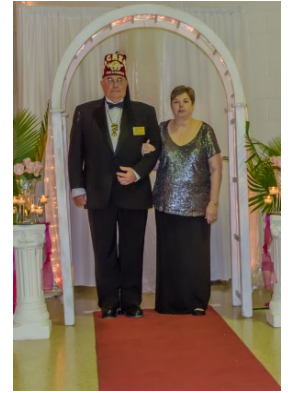

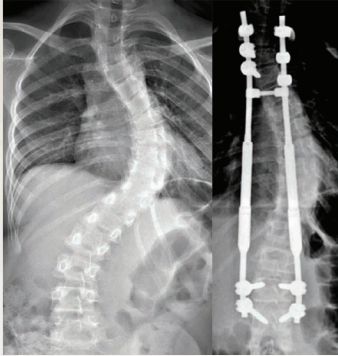

Greenville Surgeon Performs First in the Carolinas Surgery



Shriners Hospitals for Children — Greenville is proud to be the first hospital in the Carolinas to offer a new, state-of-the-art procedure for young children with scoliosis, a curvature of the spine which increases as the child grows. The MAGEC (MAGnetic Expansion Control) Spinal Bracing and Distraction System is composed of two magnetic, telescoping rods that can be gradually lengthened from outside of the skin, guiding a young child's curved spine, straight.

Pediatric orthopaedic surgeon, Michael Mendelow, M.D., explains, "The challenge of early onset scoliosis is to manage the curvature, which advances with growth. When the spine curves, it penetrates into the area of the chest where the lungs would be. If the curve was left as it is, when the child became an adult, they would only have a chest and lungs to support a child. This would shorten their life span and severely impact their quality of life." In the past, these large and potentially life-threatening curves were treated with traditional growing rods requiring an initial surgery to insert the rods, and then an additional surgery every 4 to 6 months as the child continues through their growing years. With the MAGEC System, the child undergoes an initial surgery to implant the rods, and then the system can be gradually lengthened from outside of the skin, in an exam room, avoiding the need for general anesthesia and an incision. "The non-invasive lengthening procedure eliminates the need for repeated lengthening surgeries. This results in significant safety, health, mental and physical benefits for the child and their family. Patients will also be able to get back to their activities of daily living sooner with this surgical option," Dr. Mendelow describes. The magnetic system also allows for more frequent lengthening, thus mimicking more normal spinal growth patterns.

Shriners Hospitals for Children — Greenville has a dedicated team of pediatric orthopaedic surgeons who specialize in caring for all types of pediatric spinal deformities. The senior surgeons at the hospital have decades of experience, and are internationally known for their clinical research on the treatment of scoliosis.

Shriners Hospitals for Children offers the following treatment plans based on the severity of the scoliosis:

- Observation: for curves measuring less than 25 degrees doctors follow patients every four to six months while the patient is growing.
- Risser casting: for children with infantile scoliosis.
- Bracing: for curves greater than 25 degrees and the child is still growing.
- Growing rods: for curves greater than 45 degrees and the child is still growing.
- Fusion surgery: for curves greater than 45 degrees.
