This is your newsletter/magazine, it should contain what you want to see in it.



In Memoriam Noble Al Williams - Shriner of the Year - 2015 12 Jaunary 1946 - 16 July 2016

Brother Albert (Al) C. Williams of Daleville passed away Saturday July 16, 2016 at his residence. He was 70 years old. 













