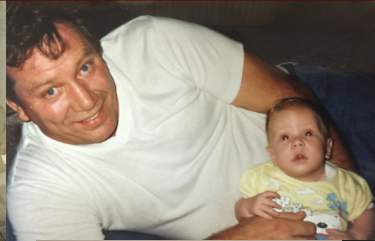
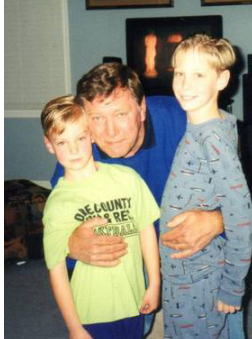
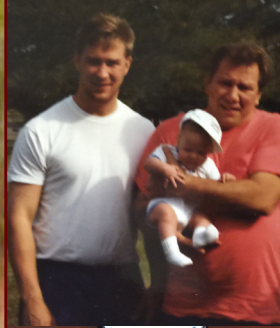
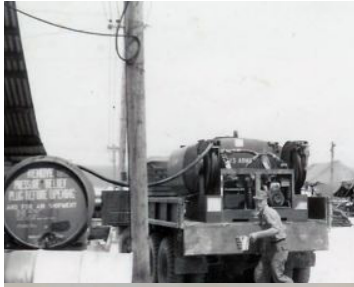
Noble Al Williams - Shriner of the Year - 2015

Brother Albert (Al) C. Williams of Daleville passed away Saturday July 16, 2016 at his residence. He was 70 years old. He was born 12 January 1946 in Pennsylvania where he lived the early years of his life. He enlisted in the United States Army serving two combat tours in Vietnam and retired after 20 years of service. He was later employed in army aviation maintenance until his retirement in 2011.

He was a lifetime member of VFW Post 6020, Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter # 373, a Master Mason of Carmichael Lodge # 548, a 32nd Degree Scottish Rite Mason, a Noble of Alcazar Shrine Temple, and Wiregrass Shrine Club where he served two terms as club president. He was honored as the Alcazar Temple Shriner of the Year for 2015.

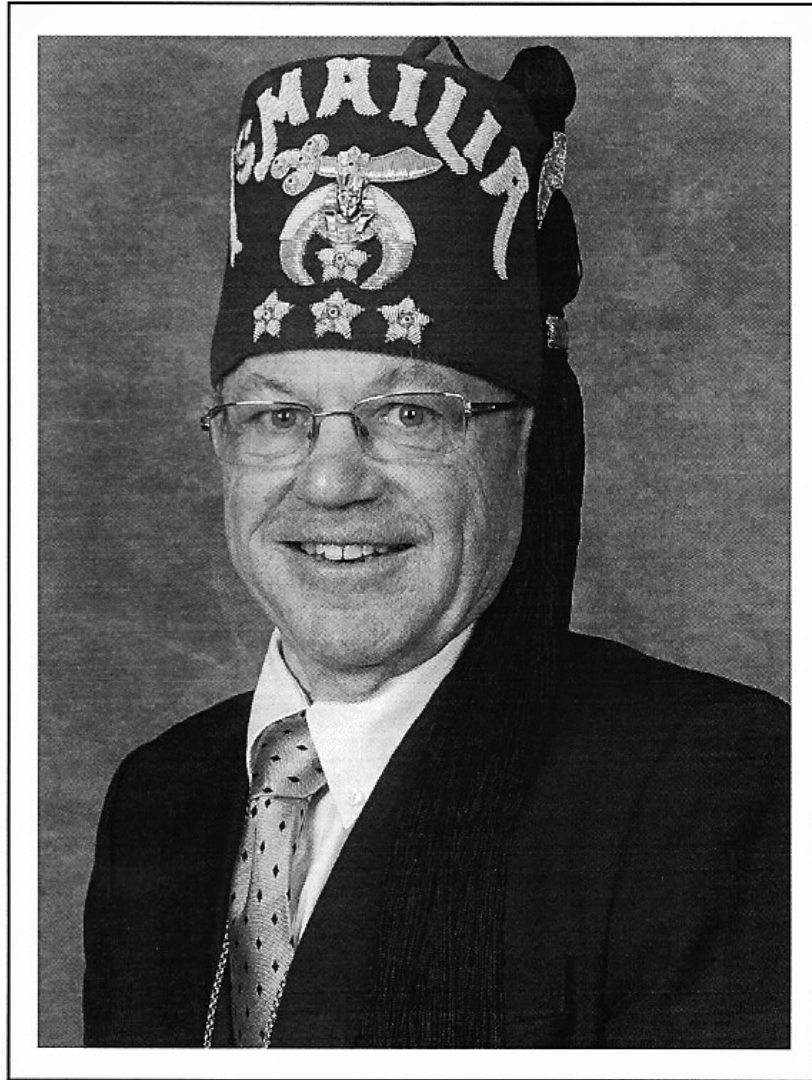

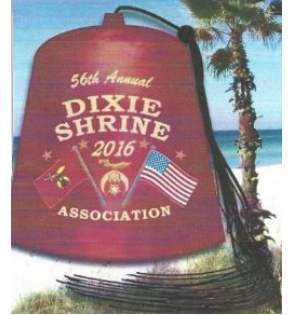
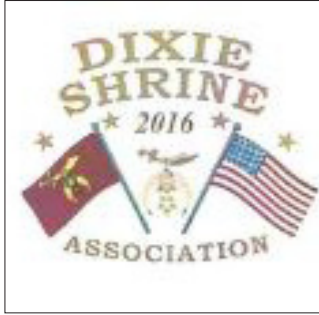

Our primary goal in hosting the tournament is to increase public awareness of Shriners Hospitals for Children and our secondary goal is to raise money for our hospital system. Nobles and Ladies this is a charitable fundraiser and 100 % of the NET profit will benefit our hospitals system. So you can be "Loud and Proud" when you speak about this event and help us sell team and/or recruit sponsors!

We will be needing volunteers to help on tournament day as well as Nobles and Ladies to help recruit teams and sell sponsorships. In a time that seems lost with devastating earthquakes, a global recession, and people just not knowing where to turn, there is always something that stands as a beacon of light, reviving some of us with a hope for humanity. To some of us that something is the Shriners. They stand tall among us helping people many of whom they do not know. Just one of the many they have helped is named Derek.

Derek was a normal boy, a child that was innocent and enjoyed life. He ran and played like any child, until that day of horrible tragedy when he was burnt by fire over most of his body. It was chaos nobody knew what to do, or how to help him. One group did and took his family by the hand, and guided them on what would seem like an endless journey of surgeries and pain. That group is known as the Shriners, but to Derek and his family they are known as saviors that have shown nothing but compassion.

The Shriners started working with Derek in the year 2000 and have helped him since. They have taken him on countless trips to the Shriners hospital in Cincinnati, Ohio, for his surgeries and check ups. Trips Derek's family could not have made because of the lack of money. But the Shriners help he has made every appointment needed for his recovery. They do more for Derek than drive a bus to and from the hospital; they have become his friends, and in Derek's heart they have become family. The surgeries he has gone through has given him the opportunity at a normal life, one that at first seemed impossible to imagine. He gets better as time goes on. He goes to school, and even goes hunting with his grandfather. These may seem simple to some, but to our family they are miracles that we see everyday. We owe it all to the Shriners even though they say we owe them nothing. And for this we are always grateful.

Some may see Derek's scars as imperfections. But we see them as proof of the power of the human spirit, and the power of love. We see them as proof that life will go on, no matter how bad it gets. Because there will always be people like the Shriners, who stand like angels among us helping those who need it the most.
