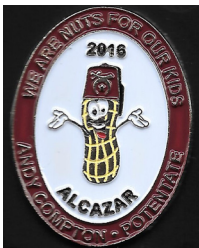

ORIENTAL GUIDE - MUST BE SELECTED WISELY

When the members of a Shrine Temple elect a Noble to the office of Oriental Guide, they are virtually starting that Noble through the Divan line on the assumption that he will prove qualified for and worthy of advancement to the high office of Illustrious Potentate.

Hence, it is quite evident that the nomination for Oriental Guide should be based on thorough and accurate evaluation of character, ability, prestige, interest and experience.

A Noble can be a good fellow, a hard worker, and a loyal Shriner...and yet lack the basic qualifications which make a good Potentate. Unless a Noble is fully qualified, he is unfair both to himself and his Temple in seeking the office or in permitting his fellow Nobles to support and promote his candidacy.

Each Shrine Temple needs and requires able, quality leadership. The normal starting point of that leadership is the office of Oriental Guide. The following checklist may prove helpful in evaluating potential candidates for the office of Oriental Guide. However, no thinking man would be naïve or presumptuous as to believe that any one Noble could possibly embody all of the virtues, talents, and qualifications which are set forth in this checklist. Nevertheless, the list has practical value...for self-evaluation by the Noble whose ultimate aspiration is the office of Illustrious Potentate... and for the advance evaluation of potential candidates by the voting members.

1. He should have good business judgement.
2. He should have the ability to express himself clearly, in language that will make us proud of him, rather than apologetic.
3. He should present an imposing personal appearance.
4. He should be able to hold his own and advance the interest of his Temple and Freemasonry, in high places as well as among the humble.
5. He should be a devoted Mason, and constantly promote the interest of Freemasonry, in high places as well as among the humble.
6. He should be proud, yet humble.
7. He should have a good character and a past open to investigation.
8. He should be a leader, have good standing his community, and be influential in its affairs.
9. He should be financially secure.
10. He should be in good health, full of energy and vitality.
11. He should be able to devote ample time to his Shrine duties.
12. He should be a man who, when he appears anywhere in public, you will be proud of, not apologetic for his short comings.

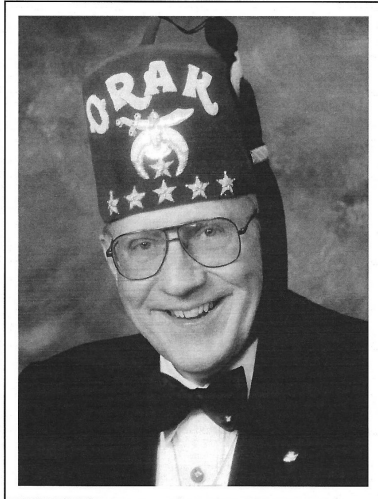

Robert Bowen "Bob" Bailey, who served as Imperial Potentate of Shriners of North America (now known as Shriners International) during the 1995-1996 Imperial Year, passed away on August 18, 2016.

Imperial Sir Bailey, 90, of Ogdon Dunes, Indiana, was born in Evansville, Indiana, to the Rev. Dr. Joyce J. and Serena B. Bailey. He graduated from Crown Point High School and attended DePauw University for two years and the University of Evansville, where he received his Bachelor of Arts degree. He later served on the Board of Trustees at the University of Evansville, and was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters for his Masonic and community service on behalf of children. In 1996, the Governor of the State of Indiana awarded Imperial Sir Bailey with the Sagamore of the Wabash for his distinguished service to humanity.

While in college, Imperial Sir Bailey met Sarah Dorman of Gary, Indiana; they were married for 58 years until Sarah's death in 2007.

Imperial Sir Bailey began his Masonic journey in 1941 as a member of the Order of DeMolay. In 1951, he became a Master Mason and a member of the Scottish Rite, and in 1952, he joined Orak Shriners in Michigan City, Indiana, and served as Potentate in 1969. He was the charter member and first Director of the Orak Shrine Ritual Cast, and served as Recorder of Orak Shriners for six years. In 1979, Imperial Sir Bailey was coroneted a 33rd Degree Scottish Rite Mason. He was a member of all York Rite bodies, and was awarded the Knight Commander of the Temple. He was also recognized by the Great Lakes Shrine Association as an Honorary President and was presented with the Thomas W. Melham Humanitarian Award. Imperial Sir Bailey also served on the board of the Indiana Masonic Home for six years, including three years as Chairman. In 1996, he was given the Caleb B. Smith award by the Grand Lodge of Indiana.

Imperial Sir Bailey was predeceased by his wife, Sarah, and their son, Jim (Kristin Weis); his sister, Evelyn; and brother-in-law, Guy Slaughter.

13. His wife should be able to understand his devotion to duty, realize that we will become Potentate and not she; be able to dress and wear appropriate clothing, and be familiar with the social amenities. Remember, she is destined to become first lady.

Nominations for Oriental Guide should be based upon thorough and accurate evaluation of character, ability, and interest.

Remember, you are electing your spokesman and standard bearer, the one who will represent you and your temple.

We have great nobles in our Temple. Let us seek out the best man we can find who is willing to make the sacrifices. And it requires great sacrifice!

Many Temples have suffered from inferior Potentates because of the judgement and oversight of qualifications when selecting Oriental Guides.

Imperial Sir Bailey served as Imperial Potentate of Shriners International and Chairman of the Board of Directors of Shriners Hospitals for Children® for the 1995-1996 Imperial Year. Prior to that, he served on the Board of Governors of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago for 13 years in several capacities, including Secretary and Vice-Chairman; ultimately he was named an Emeritus member.

Imperial Sir Bailey's other Masonic memberships and distinctions include the Cabiri; Past Director of Court #43, Royal Order of Jesters; Royal Order of Scotland; Sovereign of St. Hilary Conclave and Honorary Member of St. Cyril Conclave; Indiana College of the Societas Rosicrucianae; Indiana Council of Deliberation Medal of Honor; Medal of Distinguished Service from the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction; Tall Cedars of Lebanon; Swords of Bunker Hill; Legion of Honor of DeMolay International; Board of Directors of the Indiana DeMolay Foundation; Honorary President of the Ohio Shrine Association.

Imperial Sir Bailey and his wife, Sarah, were always proud of their Masonic heritage. Both of their fathers, grandfathers and great-grandfathers were Masons, as well as several uncles and cousins. The family is proud to count 36 Masons from both sides of the family.

Imperial Sir Bailey was president of Fifth Avenue Motors, a Buick automobile agency, and Monarch Oil, distributors of gasoline, oil and lubricants, both located in Gary. He is also a Past President and 30-year member of the Rotary club of Gary with perfect attendance, and was awarded a Paul Harris Fellow, the highest award given in Rotary International.

Imperial Sir Bailey was a life member of the United Methodist Church, and a member of the First United Methodist Church of Portage, Indiana, where he served as Chairman of the Endowment and Finance Committees, and a member of the Administrative Council. In past years, he served the Northwest Indiana and North Indiana Conferences as a member of the World Service and Finance Commission, the Board of Directors of the Indiana Methodist Children's Home and the Commission on Higher Education.

Imperial Sir Bailey is survived by his sons, John (Janis Lourgos) and Bill (Debby Owens). John and Janis have a daughter, Caroline. Bill and Debby have two sons, Rob (Jacqueline Beaulieu) and Ross (Jessica Anderson), Kris Bailey (Weis) has three children, Lauren (Brock Shipley), great-grandson Isaac; Jordan (Emily Richardson-Rosbach) and Leslie (Adam Marlatt). Imperial Sir Bailey was particularly proud of his nephew, Geoffrey G. Slaughter (Julie Randolph), who was recently appointed as a justice to the Indiana Supreme Court.
